



Pennsylvania Chafee Education and Training Grant Program

Am I Eligible?

To be considered for this grant, you must:

- Be a Pennsylvania resident
- Be eligible for services under Pennsylvania's John H. Chafee Foster Care Independence Program
- Be identified as a youth in foster care or a youth discharged or adopted from foster care after age 16
- Be participating in the Chafee Program on your 21st birthday until you turn 23 years old
- Be enrolled at least half time in a college or career school that is approved by the U.S. Department of Education for Title IV student assistance programs
- Demonstrate financial need for the grant (as determined by the postsecondary institution)
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress (as determined by the postsecondary institution)
- Not be in default on a federal student loan

How Much Can I Expect to Receive?

The maximum award under this program is \$3,000 per academic year. However, no award may exceed your cost of attendance minus any other financial aid you receive.

Awards are contingent on federal funding and are not guaranteed. New applicants are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.
