KidsVoice mission statement: To advocate in court and in the community to ensure a safe and permanent home for abused, neglected, and at-risk children; and to advocate for former clients through age 24 to help make a successful transition to adulthood by removing roadblocks to employment, health, and housing.



A multidisciplinary team made up of an attorney and a child advocacy specialist (social service professional with a background in social work, mental health, education or other related field) works with each child. The team advocates in court and other settings to ensure the child's physical, emotional, and development needs are being met. The team works closely with CYF, service providers, foster parents, and family members.

<u>Providing Legal Advocacy for Transition-</u> <u>Age Youth in Pennsylvania</u>

CLIENT SUCCESS STORIES

Nova, a young child with autism, was found starving and wandering with no clothes or shoes on. KidsVoice worked to ensure that Nova has a safe home, much-needed medical care, and the supportive school environment she needs to learn.



Nova, at the age of 5, was found wandering alone on the side of the road with no clothes or shoes on. Nova's mom struggled with drug and alcohol abuse and could not care for Nova's extensive needs. She was malnourished, which resulted in her teeth rotting. Nova had never spent time with other children, learned to use the bathroom, or learned to climb stairs. She had not been enrolled in school or seen a doctor. Nova has since been diagnosed with autism and severe developmental delays, requiring full-time assistance.

KidsVoice worked to ensure a safe placement for Nova with a family that had the right experience to help Nova address her many medical, behavioral, and trauma-related needs. Nova and her foster parents have been a great fit, and she has grown in so many ways. We connected Nova and her family with a specialized organization that provides additional therapy and is helping Nova learn the many skills she had not been exposed to.

At the same time, KidsVoice also successfully advocated for Nova's other needs to be met. On the health front, we ensured that the necessary resources were promptly in place for Nova to receive dental surgery so she could begin eating a more regular diet. In terms of education, we made sure that a special education evaluation was done on an accelerated timeline, found a school with the resources and expertise Nova needed, and made sure she was promptly enrolled and had specialized transportation arranged.

Nova is doing great with her new siblings at home, and she is working with a full-time aide at school who reports that "It is an understatement to say Nova is thriving!"

CLIENT SUCCESS STORIES

James, a nine-year-old with chronic medical conditions, had missed a substantial amount of school because the school's wheelchair lift frequently broke down. KidsVoice helped James get back in the classroom with his friends.




The adoptive mother of James, a nine-year-old former KidsVoice client with chronic medical conditions, called KidsVoice to see if we could help with challenges James faced at school. James' condition requires him to use a wheelchair, and he had missed a substantial amount of school because the school's wheelchair lift frequently broke down.

The disruption left James feeling isolated and falling behind in his learning. KidsVoice stepped in to successfully negotiate with the school district about replacing the wheelchair lift entirely over the summer. After many months of persistent advocacy, the installation has been completed, and James has rejoined his friends at school!

Children are my favorite humans, so having a good time with kids is kind of my jam. I love to volunteer during Kites for Kids [KidsVoice's annual day of play and public awareness] because I get to see our clients having fun. Seeing the smiles on their faces and their carefreeness makes my day.





DID YOU KNOW?



Beyond our legal representation of children, KidsVoice also advocates for positive change through policy, legislation, and appellate work (see below). We effectively respond to systemic issues as they arise, such as helping clients with disabilities create 529 ABLE accounts so these youth could participate in an Allegheny County cash benefit program without endangering their current Social Security benefits.

Successful PA Supreme Court Case

In 2023, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court agreed with KidsVoice in a decision that will prevent children from being stuck in foster care without the possibility of ever being adopted, even when they can never be reunified with their parents.

The case involved a seven-year-old child who had spent the prior six years in a stable, loving pre-adoptive kinship foster home. It was undisputed that the child's mother would never be able to safely care for her, and all of the child's contact with her mother was supervised. It was also undisputed that the foster family was meeting all of the child's special needs and that the child considered the foster family to be her family. Despite that, the trial court denied the petition to terminate parental rights because the court found that there existed some positive bond between the child and her mother. The Superior Court, in a divided decision, affirmed. That meant that the child could not be adopted and would never become a full member of the only family she knew.

While a positive bond is important to consider, the Supreme Court ruled for the position that KidsVoice argued, that the existence of such a bond is not enough by itself to deny a child lifelong permanency through adoption. The Court clarified that trial courts across the Commonwealth must consider: (1) whether the bond is "necessary and beneficial"; (2) the child's need for permanency and length of time already in foster care; (3) whether the child is in a pre-adoptive home and bonded with the foster parents; and (4) whether the foster home is meeting the child's developmental, physical, and emotional needs.

With this guidance, this child and many in similar situations across the state will be able to achieve the timely permanency that they deserve and so desperately need.



Kites for Kids, our signature awareness event, invites our clients—children and youth in Allegheny County who are in the foster care system—to have a fun day of learning and exploring the Carnegie Science Center for free. KidsVoice staff and sponsors presented fun games and learning activities.
