KidsVoice provides legal representation to children with open dependency cases in Allegheny County. We help these children navigate challenges in many areas of their lives.



## Safety

Our clients' safety is our number one priority. In court, we advocate for them to live in a safe and secure environment, preferably with family/kin.

## Education

Clients often come into care behind in school. We work to keep them from falling further behind by advocating for special education resources, behavioral supports, and transportation.

## Permanency

Our goal is to achieve a safe and permanent home for our clients, preferably through reunification, but when that is not possible, through adoption or permanent legal custody.

## Immediate Needs

In addition to basic needs, we advocate for our clients to maintain family ties when possible to preserve a sense of normalcy.

## Health

We help caregivers address complex medical, dental, and mental health needs by ensuring access to prior records, specialists, and transportation assistance.

KidsVoice works with our clients even after they age out of foster care, often with few assets and no safety net. We help clients remove roadblocks to independent living and support clients who become parents.

## Expansion Program

Our Expansion team helps clients through age 24 transition to stable adult lives by providing legal representation, expunging delinquency records, addressing credit and driver's license issues, and assisting with disability benefits. These services address potential roadblocks in many crucial areas.

## Two-Generation Advocacy

Our two-gen team supports parenting or pregnant clients (through age 29), empowering them to build stable lives for their own children. We connect clients with resources for housing, job training, subsidized or free childcare, and resources to address their children's health and developmental needs.



## Housing

We work with county partners to identify and create new dedicated housing resources.



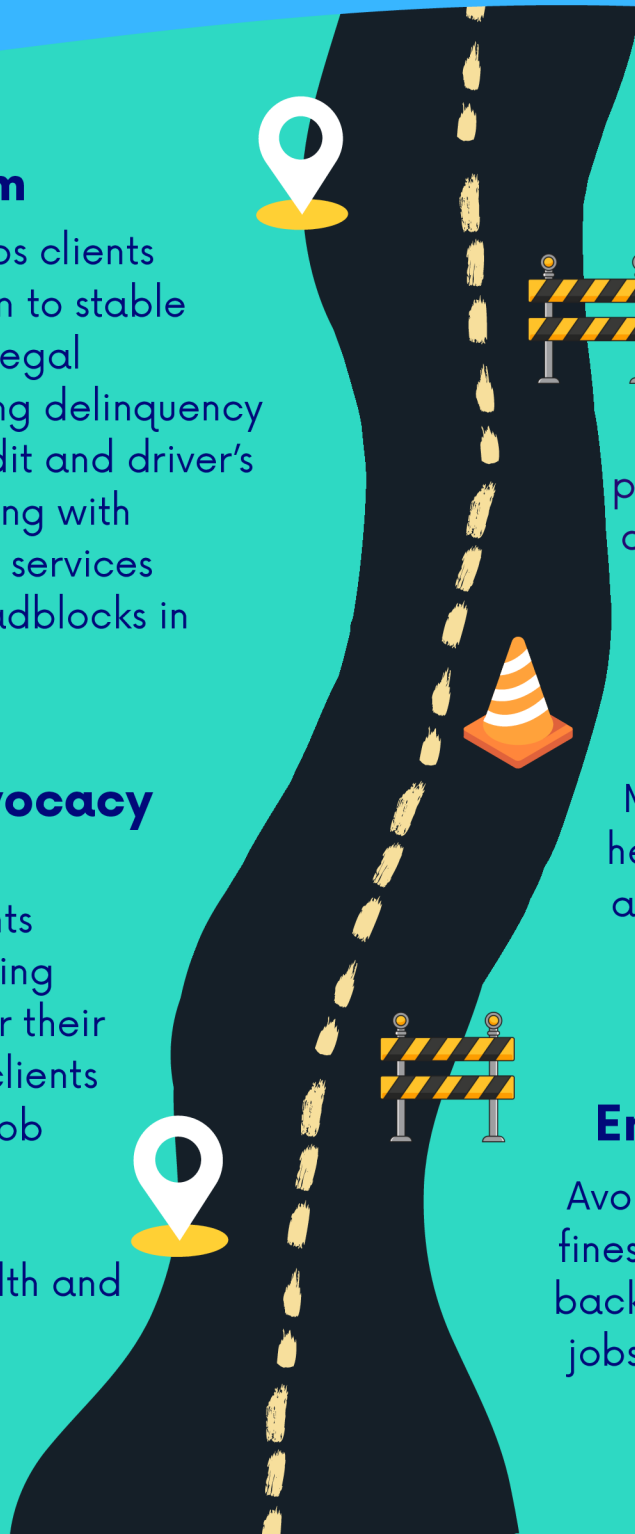
## Health

Medical partnerships help ensure that clients are able to access the care they need.



## Employment

Avoiding records and fines helps clients pass background checks for jobs and job training.



*Jace has taken a positive, resilient approach along a difficult path, despite his complex medical needs.*

Jace's mother, who struggled with drug and alcohol abuse, was not able to give him the care and safety he needed as a child. Jace was hit by a car when he was 5. He suffered a traumatic brain injury that resulted in intellectual and developmental disabilities as well as poor short-term memory. He also had irreparable hip and spinal damage. Since the accident, Jace has used a wheelchair.

After the accident, the family agreed it would be best for Jace to move in with his grandmother, who became his primary caregiver. She did the best she could to take care of Jace, but she increasingly struggled with her own health needs. Sadly, Jace's grandmother died when he was eight. At that point, Jace entered the child welfare system and spent time in various kinship placements, but his relatives were not able to care for his complex needs. The frequent changes were hard on Jace, and he often missed school.

When KidsVoice got involved, Jace had been placed in a foster home. The foster family was willing to help Jace with his medical care and ensure that he was getting the treatment he needed at school. Jace's clothes and shoes were lost when he was moved from place to place with different family members. He was proud of his sneaker collection and missed them most when he arrived at his new foster home. KidsVoice successfully advocated for Jace to receive a clothing voucher to help replace what was lost. Unfortunately, the foster family became overwhelmed and decided not to continue their care of Jace.

KidsVoice helped identify Sara, a distant relative of Jace's who was happy to open her home to him. Sara and Jace quickly bonded. Sara had been in a biking accident and had spent time in a wheelchair as well. Because of this, her home was already well prepared to be accessible for Jace: there was a ramp, a roll-in shower, and lower countertops. Jace's new home was closer to his school, but the district's walking-only policy and the house's location at the top of a very steep hill created a dual challenge for his attendance and transportation logistics. KidsVoice reminded the district that they were legally obligated to provide transportation, and that we would litigate the issue if necessary. For a month, KidsVoice worked with the transportation office to find a successful solution to get Jace to school each day.

Over the past three years, Jace has continued to attend school regularly and make progress in learning important life skills that he will need to live independently. Jace is nearing the end of his time in high school, but KidsVoice has already been working for many months with Jace, Sara, and his county support teams to plan for Jace's longer-term future and his ability to live independently.

KidsVoice has had great success in advocating for our clients with intellectual disabilities to receive highly competitive state-funded waivers that provide lifelong benefits in areas like housing and care. In order for Jace to receive a waiver, he needed a formal diagnosis for his intellectual disability. We helped the family arrange for a prompt evaluation by a neurophysiologist who was able to make that diagnosis.

KidsVoice then worked with the family to get Jace enrolled with the county's Office of Developmental Supports, which opens up several potential avenues for obtaining the financial, logistical, and health supports that Jace will need to live independently after leaving foster care. When the time comes, we will also help Jace apply for Social Security disability benefits, another important form of financial support and stability to fund Jace's long-term care.



At one point, there was a challenge in court as to whether Jace would be better off moving into an assisted living group home for foster youth with severe disabilities. Sara disagreed, as did KidsVoice, and we argued that being with a family was in Jace's best interest. He simply wouldn't get the same care in a group home as in a home setting. The court decided that Jace would remain with his foster mother, and Jace was overjoyed. Sara and Jace are both doing well, and he is excited about attending his first school prom this year.

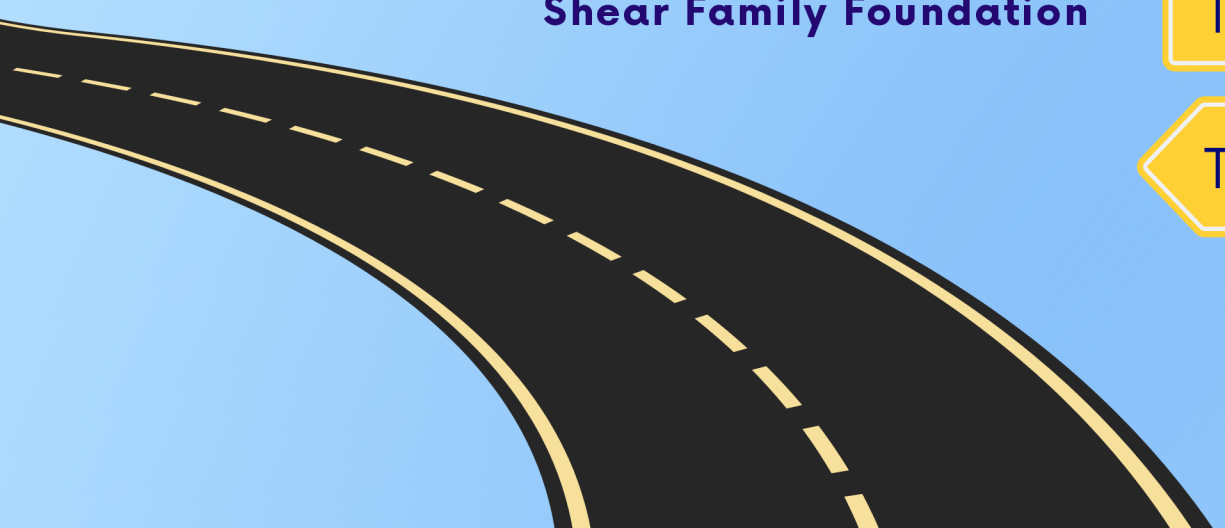
