## High-quality early childhood education shouldn't come at a high price.

There are challenges, especially child care issues, associated with being a parent, low-income, and a full-time student. In 2015, over 57,000 babies were born to single mothers in the state of Pennsylvania.<sup>1</sup> Additionally, less than half of teen mothers receive a high school diploma by the age of 22.<sup>2</sup> Without adequate support, these young parents are likely to become trapped in a cycle of poverty driven by lowpaying jobs and financial dependency.
