### Our Mission

To advocate in court and in the community to ensure a safe and permanent home for abused, neglected and at-risk children; and to advocate for former clients through age 24 to help them make a successful transition to adulthood by removing roadblocks to employment, health, and housing.

## KIDSVOICE TIMELINE

**1908**

**The Legal Aid Society of Pittsburgh is created**, with the mission of serving the poor.

**1970**

**A Child Advocacy Unit is created** within the Legal Aid Society to specifically address the needs of abused, neglected, and at-risk children.

**1983**

**The Legal Aid Society's sole mission becomes serving children.**

**Organization adopts the name KidsVoice.**

**2001**

To meet growing needs, **KidsVoice transitions from traditional one-attorney model to team model.** All clients now supported by an attorney, child advocacy specialist, and expert support.

**2011**

Recognizing educational roadblocks for our clients, **a dedicated education team is created.**

**KidsVoice inspires the hit CBS TV show "The Guardian."**

**2015**

**Bootstrap Program launches** to break down barriers for former clients through age 24.

**2020**

**Emergency pandemic response focuses efforts.** Priorities include health and mental health, housing stability, and older youth outreach.

**2021**

**Education team expands** to address disparities left in COVID-19's wake.

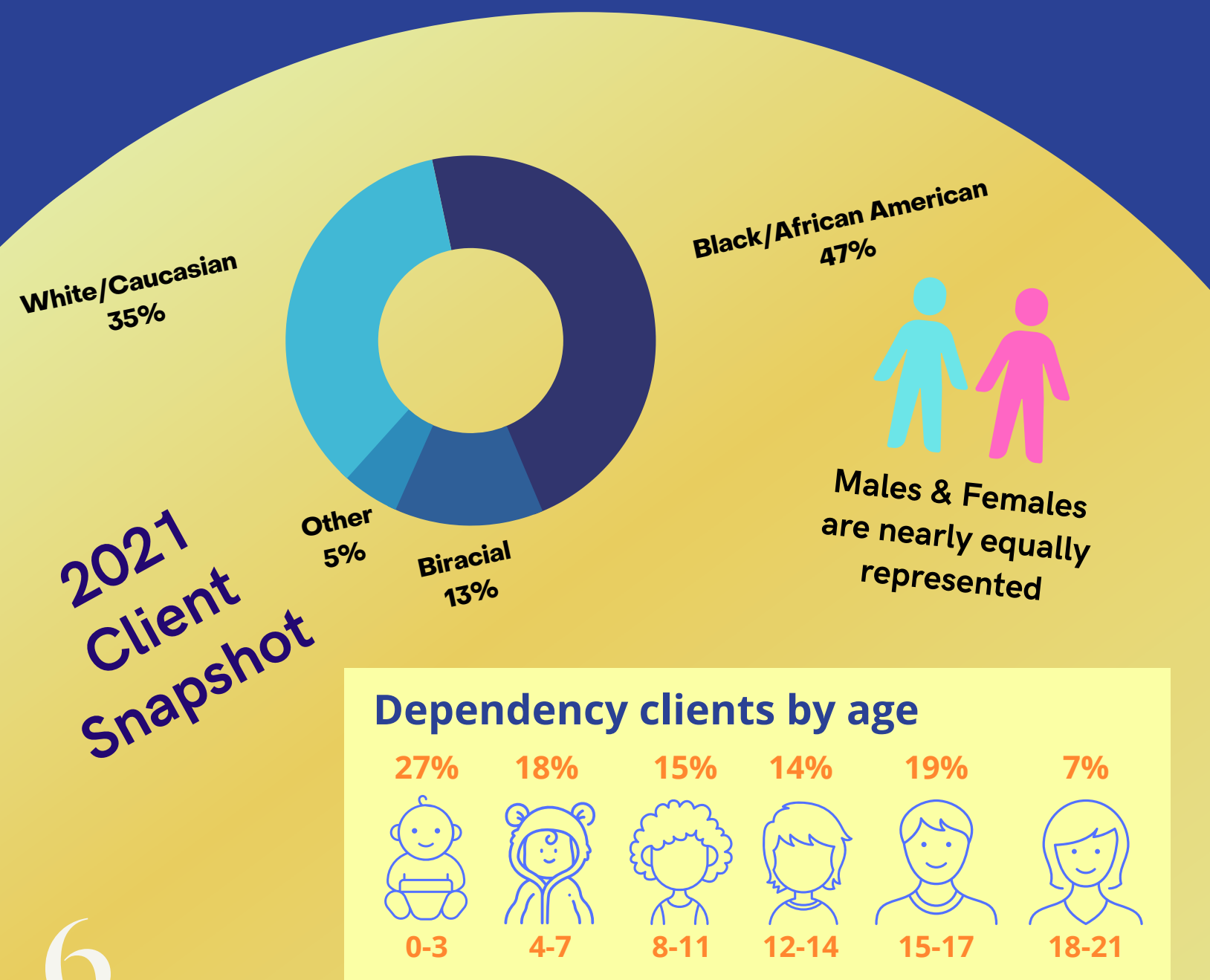

# Core Work

KidsVoice advocates on behalf of more than 3,000 abused, neglected and at-risk children, ages 0-21, in the Allegheny County child welfare and juvenile court system each year. Every KidsVoice client has a core team of an attorney and child advocacy specialist (a social service professional). This team advocates in court and in the community for each child's unique needs and to ensure that child has a safe and permanent home, with family reunification a primary focus.



## MINKAH FITZPATRICK PLAYS FOR KIDSVOICE

Steelers star safety Minkah Fitzpatrick teamed with KidsVoice in 2021 to protect the rights and well-being of children in the foster care system. In May, Minkah met dozens of KidsVoice clients, providing bikes, helmets, sneakers, and other goodies to encourage healthy play. He also surprised one of our two-generation families—a former KidsVoice client raising her three young sons—with sports equipment, educational toys, and books. Later in the year, Minkah put his on-field talents to work, raising funds for our advocacy work through a season-long Tackle & Turnover pledge campaign. Between Minkah's 124 tackles and the team's numerous forced turnovers, pledged donations reached an astounding \$64,718!

We are so grateful for the support of Minkah's Unshackled Foundation, as well as donations from six more players AND a match through the Steelers Social Justice Fund, for helping to make our work possible. We look forward to seeing what 2022 brings in this evolving team-up!

# Education

Right now, KidsVoice is the court-appointed Educational Decision Maker for 249 children. We also advocate for the educational needs of hundreds more of our school-aged clients. Advocating for children's education rights has been an integral part of our work since 2011, when our dedicated education team was established. That is because national data suggests a grim educational outlook for children in the foster care system. Only about half graduate from high school and less than 5% from a four-year college.

Spurred on by disparities further exacerbated by the pandemic, KidsVoice enacted a two-fold initiative in 2021:

1. **Pandemic Education Response Team** A third of our clients receive special education services, putting them at greater risk of learning loss during the pandemic. These children have fallen behind academically, socially, and even physically. Our targeted advocacy is working to address their most critical needs and recoup lost services.
2. **Expanded Education Team** Three new education attorney positions were created and the team restructured to optimize advocacy by allocating a dedicated education attorney to represent each of the five county regions.

Using these enhanced resources, KidsVoice will strengthen each child's legal right to education. Donor support allows us to develop these new programs and help improve children's attendance, grades, and graduation rates.

## RAYMOND'S STORY

Raymond\* graduated high school in spring 2021. Cheered on by his grandmother and siblings in the stands, the moment was one he had dreamed of for years. Raymond, who has an intellectual disability and multiple mental health diagnoses, has always enjoyed learning. However, when KidsVoice was appointed to his case in 2017, he was living in a facility where his educational and emotional needs weren't adequately met.

KidsVoice successfully advocated for a school transition plan that allowed him to return to a traditional education setting for his final years of school. There, he thrived. In addition to math and reading, he learned invaluable life and job skills. He was especially excited to learn how to type. KidsVoice's advocacy also directly led to a change in Raymond's placement, to an adult supervised independent living facility where he could learn to live on his own before his dependency case closed. With a growing confidence instilled through his education and independence, Raymond found a job he loved in retail. He looks forward to a world of future possibilities.

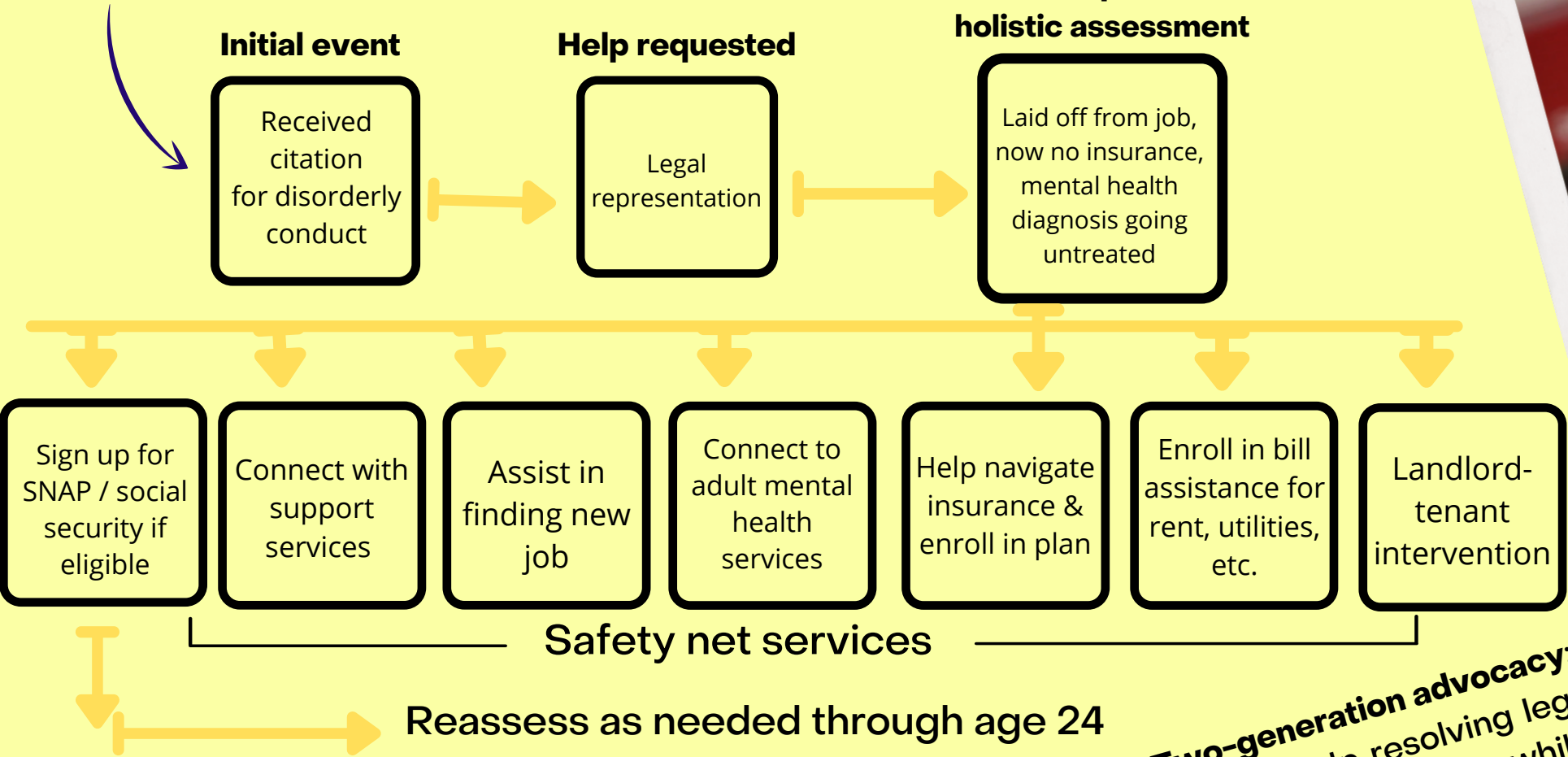

# Social Justice

**When appearing before a judge for a minor infraction,** foster youth are often at an immediate disadvantage for the simple fact that they may not have a reliable parent or adult in their lives to help them navigate the justice system. KidsVoice and our pro bono partners provide free representation in summary offense hearings to current and former clients, thus reducing unnecessary criminal charges and fines that can become barriers to housing and employment. This can make a difference between homelessness and a stable life. In addition to representing youth before the magistrate for summary offenses, such as disorderly conduct, we also work to expunge juvenile records so that our youth can enter adulthood with a clean slate.

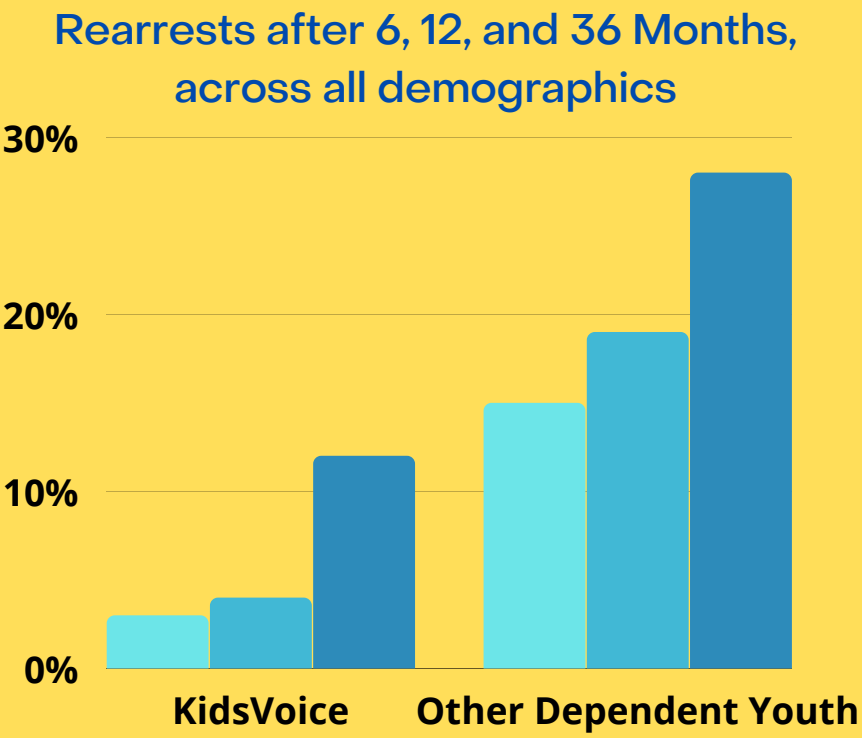

Overall success rate for summary offense representation in 2021, resulting in a dismissal or not guilty decision. This is more than twice the success rate of dependent youth in Allegheny County who are not represented by KidsVoice.



### Program Success

Since 2015, KidsVoice has represented hundreds of youth in magistrate hearings with a cumulative 79% success rate across all racial and gender demographics, much higher than other dependent youth (38%), or even youth who were never dependent (46%).

This success is especially crucial for our clients of color, who already face discrimination in housing and employment: About two-thirds of dependent youth with summary offenses are black.

After representing a youth, we provide them additional legal advocacy and supports to help in other areas, like health, job training, and subsidized housing. The impact has been positive. Over a three-year period, our clients had far lower re-arrest rates [see left] when compared to other dependent youth.
